technology. To enable children to engage in PE in a more accessible area and indoors an interactive white board was purchased and installed in a communal area for the whole school. This promoted daily fitness with Joe Wicks and other keep fit sessions with music and videos. £2350.

5 extra morning sessions with the coach £250 Children participated in extra sporting activities during SATs week to release frustrations and tensions and focus on team work and keeping active.

Importance of personal well-being.

This in turn will increase their capacity to focus and perform better during exams. Feedback from children and listening to their wishes showed to make exam times less stressful and getting more fresh air.

Three garden areas are being developed for each class to grow vegetables to use in cooking and eat. £700 (on going)

Parental questionnaires were positive about engagement of children and our provision.

Outside learning area is developing and children are working towards implementing the forest school area (£2500) in their curriculum. Including clearing the area and tarpaulins, ropes, ties and pegs for shelter building. Seating.

Outside play equipment purchased for KS1 £3200 to improve learning opportunities outside and physical exercise.

In July 2022, the number of year 6 children who could...

Provide continued swimming opportunities using local provision in the area. (funded by school)

- ...swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25m was 10 out of 11 (91%).
- ...use a range of strokes effectively was 11 out of 11 (100%).
- ...perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations was 11 out of 11 (100%).

Participation and successes will be celebrated in whole school assemblies with parents.

A good turnout at Sports day is a good indication of parental support and positive feedback will be encouraged. Improve morale and inspire the team to feel valued and a strong team presence.
