Reflective and embrace change – We are not afraid of change and believe it can be a positive opportunity for creating a better self, Trust, and society.

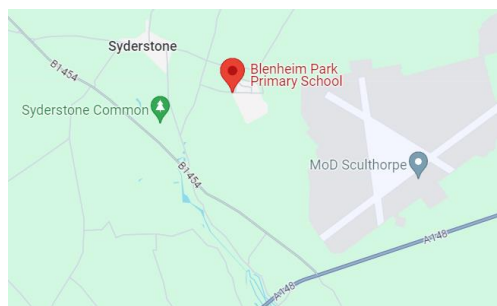
Academies within our Trust

We currently have 3 academies in our Trust.



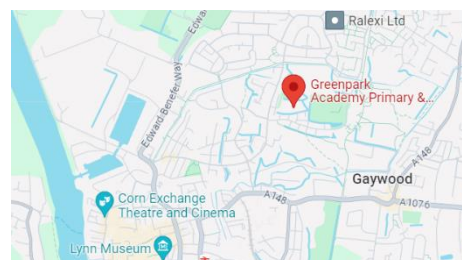
Blenheim Park

Blenheim Park is in Sculthorpe near the former RAF base. It is our smallest academy with 76 pupils. Blenheim Park joined the Trust in March 2017. Mrs Graver is the Executive Headteacher at Blenheim Park Academy.



Greenpark Academy

Greenpark Academy is in King's Lynn. Greenpark Academy, formerly known as St Edmund's Academy, was our first academy. There are 344 pupils on roll. Mrs Graver is the Executive Headteacher at Greenpark Academy.





Reffley Academy

Reffley Academy is in King's Lynn. There are 337 pupils on roll. Reffley Academy joined the Trust in August 2018. Ms Fendley is the Headteacher. We will be opening a Social, Emotional and Mental Health, Specialist Resource Base at Reffley in September 24.
